The Roxy Performing Arts Center (The Roxy) is located at 1645 SW 107 Ave., Miami, Florida 33165, directly across from Florida International University and will be New Theatre's temporary home through the end of the 2011-2012 Season.

For a very reasonable cost, The Roxy is providing New Theatre office and storage space as well as intimate theatre space. Located conveniently off of the Florida Turnpike, the Roxy's prime mission is to enrich children's lives through the performing and cultural arts, providing arts education and performance opportunities for all children in the community.

After concluding its first quarter-century, New Theatre is excited about continuing to bring South Florida audiences cutting edge theatre, give voice to new playwrights, give life to new plays and provide a home for our local actors and designers.
